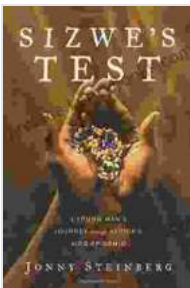


# A Young Man's Journey Through Africa's AIDS Epidemic

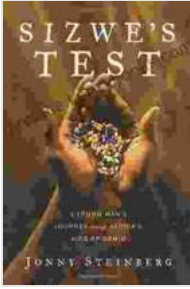

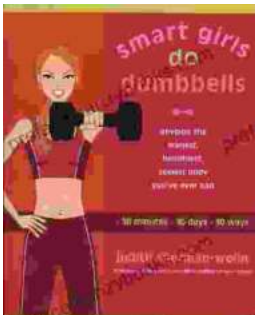

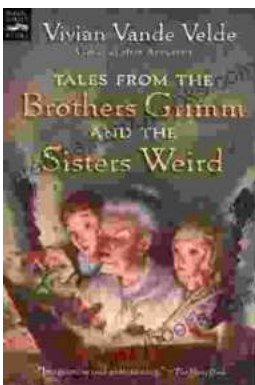
